Shooting Assignment: Still Life

Overview The Rose Bowl Flea Market is open the second Sunday of every month with over 2,500 vendors full of antiques, vintage clothing, local art, and specialty products. Regular Admission is \$10 per person, exact change only. The box office is open from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 pm and the public may shop until 4:30 pm. As of the date of this writing, buyers are asked to show a photo ID and proof of vaccination or a negative covid test within 72 hours of the event to purchase an admission ticket. Masks are required and social distancing measures are in place. Parking is free in Lot I.

Recommendation: Arrive early in the day; it can get very warm. Wear comfortable shoes, layered clothing, sunblock and bring water. There are very few vendors selling water/food due to COVID restrictions.

Carpool: Meet at 8:30 a.m. at the south end of the parking lot located on the northeast corner of Beach Boulevard and Stark Drive in Huntington Beach. This parking lot includes many businesses – Automobile Club of Southern California (AAA), BJ's Restaurant, and Party City.

- On the Rose Bowl side of town are the [Wrigley Mansion \(the Tournament of Roses house\)](#) along "[Millionaire's Row](#)" (Orange Grove Boulevard), plus the [Gamble House](#).

Old Pasadena: Visitors can discover a range of activities. From museums and historical landmarks to gardens, there is always a variety of options. <https://www.oldpasadena.org/visit/attractions/>

- In town you could park in the [Holly Street Parking Garage](#) and walk east along Holly to [Pasadena City Hall](#), built in 1927. It has a beautiful rotunda, curved staircases leading up to balconies, and a lovely little courtyard.

- Right across the street from City Hall, through the courtyard, is the historic [All Saints Episcopal Church](#)

- Right in front of City Hall on the west side is Centennial Square, where there are statues of Jackie Robinson and his brother (born and raised in Pasadena.)

- From Centennial Square, you can see Pasadena Central Library to the north (closed).
- If you continue walking west on Holly Street, back toward the parking garage, you'll see the old YWCA building on the right.
- You can keep walking along Holly Street toward [Old Pasadena](#), with plenty of interesting old buildings and alleys along the way. Memorial Park off Holly has a refurbished bandshell. Turn left on any little street to get to the main strip, Colorado Boulevard.
- The [Castle Green](#) built in 1898 is one of Pasadena's oldest historic buildings in Old Pasadena.
